from Deuteronomy and Psalms

*One:* The Lord your God is God of gods and Lord of lords, the great God, mighty and awesome who is not partial and takes no bribe,

All: who executes justice for the *orphan and the widow*, and who loves the *strangers*, providing them food and clothing.

Deuteronomy 10:17-18

*One:* When you reap your harvest in your field and forget a sheaf in the field, you shall not go back to get it;

All: it shall be left for the alien, the orphan, and the widow, so that the Lord your God may bless you in all your undertakings.

Deuteronomy 24:19

*One:* "Cursed be anyone who deprives the *alien, the orphan, and the widow* of justice."

All: All the people shall say, "Amen!"

Deuteronomy 27:19

One: The Lord watches over the strangers;

All: he upholds the *orphan and the widow*, but the way of the wicked he brings to ruin.

Psalm 146:9

One: "Father of orphans and protector of widows" is God in his holy habitation.

Psalm 68:5

All: Happy are those who consider the poor; the Lord delivers them in the day of trouble.

Psalm 41:1

One: The Word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God!

# Additional Scripture

## Ruth 1:1-5, 22

<sup>1</sup>In the days when the judges ruled, there was a famine in the land, and a certain man of Bethlehem in Judah went to live **in the country of Moab**, he and his wife and two sons. <sup>2</sup>The name of the man was Elimelech and the name of his wife Naomi, and the names of his two sons were Mahlon and Chilion; they were Ephrathites from Bethlehem in Judah. They went **into the country of Moab** and remained there. <sup>3</sup>But Elimelech, the husband of Naomi, died, and she was left with her two sons.

<sup>4</sup>**These took Moabite wives;** the name of the one was Orpah and the name of the other Ruth. When they had lived there about ten years, <sup>5</sup>both Mahlon

and Chilion also died, so that the woman was left without her two sons and her husband.  $-{}^{22}$ So Naomi returned [to Bethlehem] together with **Ruth the Moabite**, her daughter-in-law, who came back with her **from the country of Moab.** They came to Bethlehem at the beginning of the barley harvest.

#### Ruth 2:1-3, 5-6, 8-12

Now Naomi had a kinsman on her husband's side, a prominent rich man, of the family of Elimelech, whose name was Boaz. <sup>2</sup>And **Ruth the Moabite** said to Naomi, "Let me go to the field and glean among the ears of grain, behind someone in whose sight I may find favor." She said to her, "Go, my daughter." <sup>3</sup>So she went. <sup>5</sup>Then Boaz said to his servant who was in charge of the reapers, "To whom does this young woman belong?" <sup>6</sup>The servant who was in charge of the reapers answered, "**She is the Moabite** who came back with Naomi from the country of Moab. <sup>8</sup>Then Boaz said to Ruth, "Now listen, **my daughter**, do not go to glean in another field or leave this one, but keep close to my young women. <sup>9</sup>Keep your eyes on the field that is being reaped, and follow behind them. I have ordered the young men not to bother you. If you get thirsty, go to the vessels and drink from what the young men have drawn."

<sup>10</sup>Then she fell prostrate, with her face to the ground, and said to him, "Why have I found favor in your sight, that you should take notice of me, **when I am a foreigner?**"

<sup>11</sup>But Boaz answered her, "All that you have done for your mother-in-law since the death of your husband has been fully told me, and how you left your father and mother and your native land and came to a people that you did not know before. <sup>12</sup>May the Lord reward you for your deeds, and may you have a full reward from the Lord, the God of Israel, *under whose wings you have come for refuge!*"

## Zephaniah 2:9a-10

<sup>9</sup>Therefore, as I live, says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel, **Moab** shall become like Sodom and the Ammonites like Gomorrah, <sup>10</sup>This shall be their lot in return for their pride, because they scoffed and boasted against the people of the Lord of hosts.

#### Jeremiah 48:46-47

<sup>46</sup>Woe to you, **O Moab**! The people of [the god] Chemosh have perished, for your sons have been taken captive, and your daughters into captivity [by Babylon].

<sup>47</sup>Yet I will restore the fortunes of **Moab** in the latter days, says the Lord.
